Shriners Children's physician researches bone growth marker to help scoliosis care



Shriners Children's Michelle Welborn, M.D., is studying a molecule that lets physicians know when bones are growing and when the growth is complete. Her research could profoundly improve scoliosis treatment.

The molecule is relevant to bracing, one of the most commonly used treatments to correct scoliosis, or curvature of the spine. The braces are hard plastic girdles that are worn about the trunk and straighten the spine as the child grows. They are usually worn for much of the day and often for a year or more.

Up until now, physicians have only been able to determine imprecisely when a child stops growing. Dr. Welborn's marker, known as collagen X biomarker, is at high levels in the blood stream when a child is growing and drops to low levels once growth has stopped.

Using the marker, physicians could ensure that patients don't stop wearing the braces too soon, when progress might be lost, or longer than is necessary, since the braces are cumbersome and uncomfortable and no child wants to wear one longer than they have to.

"This collagen biomarker has the potential to change how we do things," said Dr. Welborn, the chief of spine surgery at Shriners Children's Portland. "Currently when we treat scoliosis patients using existing measures of skeletal maturity, we are treating them based on the average individual." The marker will help physicians customize treatment for the individual patient, she explained.

At present, according to Dr. Welborn, about 20% to 25% of patients have some return progression of their scoliosis once they stop wearing their brace, indicating, probably, that they ceased a bit too soon.

Scoliosis affects between 2% and 5% of children. If it is a mild case – that is, a slight curve of the spine – physicians often recommend regular check-ups to be sure the curvature is not getting worse, but they will watch and wait. But more severe cases have a tendency to progress and can be painful and physically limiting. Treatments range from bracing to spinal fusion to spine tethering, where a tough tether is attached to one side of the spine, restricting its growth while the other side continues to grow, resulting in straightening. Scoliosis is one of the conditions that Shriners Children's treats a lot.

Dr. Welborn's work is just one example of the cutting-edge research done at Shriners Children's hospitals and clinics.

Specialty providers generally are on the leading edge of care in their particular specialties. They're also the ones who get referrals of the most challenging cases. Since they focus on just a few conditions, they develop the most expertise.

Dr. Welborn was recently awarded a research grant and professorship from Shriners Children's that will help support her work with collagen X biomarker for five years. She's been working with the biomarker for seven years and recently confirmed, in 47 patients with scoliosis, that it can reliably be used to monitor when an individual's growth halts.

Scoliosis treatment helps teen breathe easy



By the time Michael was 15 years old, he had a scoliosis so severe that breathing was so difficult he had become malnourished from the effort.

But Shriners Children's Lexington and pediatric orthopedist Vincent Prusick, M.D., were there for him.

Michael was being adopted. His severe scoliosis had been left untreated for roughly three years and he had a spine with a curvature of 115 degrees when he was first examined at the hospital, according to his new mother, Laura.

"They told me at my first appointment that if I didn't treat my scoliosis right away, I might not make it to 16," Michael said.

But he did make it to 16 years and now beyond. His providers at Shriners Children's knew exactly what to do.

Very quickly, Michael was put in the hospital and in halo traction, to gradually stretch his spine and lessen the chance of nerve damage. He was also given a feeding tube to help him gain weight and ensure adequate nutrition.

After the traction, Dr. Prusick performed a spinal fusion procedure to stabilize his spine.

Michael was up and walking a day after his surgery. He is now 18 years old and a junior in high school who thinks he would like to become a correctional officer in the future. The curvature in his spine has been reduced to just 34 degrees — allowing him to breathe easily.

"Michael was so brave through everything," Laura said. "We are so proud of him, and we are so thankful for Shriners Children's."

She adds: "It is hard to put into words. Shriners Children's has given us a lot of peace. We felt it as soon as we walked in the doors. We knew we were cared for."

2-Club Golf is back at El Zagal for 2024!



Looking for a different kind of league to have some golf fun this summer? Come and enjoy a fun and challenging twist on golf at the El Zagal Golf Course!

Basic Rules of the League:

\$5.00 entry fee for the entire summer. You are

responsible for your own green fees. Entry form needs to be submitted to the El Zagal Shrine in the mail room box labeled 2-club golf. Players can sign up for the league up until July 1.

2-club is a league where you are only allowed to use 2 clubs for your 9 holes. This INCLUDES your putter if you choose to use it.

To be eligible for end of the season awards, you must

golf 8 rounds from May 1 until August 11. You can submit up to 16 total score cards, with the best 8 being used for your average standings. Cards are to be turned in at the El Zagal Shrine 2-club golf mailbox. Cards will be collected every Thursday from the Shrine and the standings updated. DO NOT turn cards into the El Zagal Golf Course. Qualifying for the standings will begin when 8 rounds are complete. Submitting additional cards, up to 16, can improve your standings of average score. Once 16 total cards are submitted, no other cards will be accepted, so submit your best!

Golfers must sign their card (legibly so we can record it!) and have a witness sign it also. Grab a friend and have a great time! Shriners, grab a friend who is a non-Shriner and show them the fun we have throughout the year!

This is meant to be a fun league, and you are on your honor when recording your score card.

End of the year prizes will be based on the number of players in the league, and can include cash prizes, entry into the hole-in-one tournament (\$100 value) on August 15th, or others. There is no cap on the number of players in the league! Prizes will be awarded on August 13th.

Open to all men and women, but players must be 18 and older.

Green Fees for El Zagal -
