





# **Misfit** Munchies





The Shriner's Children's Open is October 14-20, 2024. We are again set to work Hole 15 for Thursday through Sunday.



Emily, a Bismarck Public Schools Empower[Ed] student, sat down with Kristen Weise, Luke's mother, to discuss how the Shriners have impacted their life. Read Below to learn more about one of our many success stories!









## Luke Weise

This is the story of Luke Weise. He was born with a bilateral cleft lip and palate. Luke's parents had a family friend reach out, who is a Shriner advocate/sponsor. Luke and his family got involved with the Shriners in the summer of 2023. The Shriners established a cleft team in Chicago to work with Luke to coordinate all surgeries, as well as hearing and speech development for the foreseeable future.

Shriners is establishing a relationship with Luke and his parents to fully understand his emotional, physical repairment, and developmental needs so that he can be a successful person in all aspects of life. Luke had a cleft palate surgery in February of 2024. Shriners will be doing all of Luke's major surgeries. Around the age of seven or eight he will be seen for bone grafting. Following his surgeries will be extensive orthodontic work and near the age of 21 Luke will be able to have a final rhinoplasty.

## Family Reflections

Luke's parents have been pleasantly surprised by the care and coordination of Shriners. The closest Shriners cleft clinic requires the family to fly and travel a distance in order for Luke to receive care. Shriners takes care of the appointments and books a space at the Ronald McDonald house for Luke and his family to stay. Kristen says "this helps us focus on Luke and his needs."

Luke's parents are looking forward to Luke and his sister getting to the age to start doing more activities as a family. They are looking forward to planting their garden, and enjoy the outdoors along with going on many bike rides.
