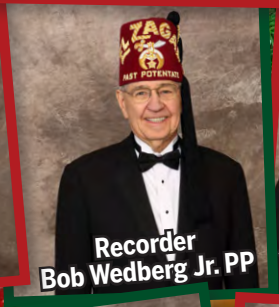

THE SWITZER FAMILY



Abigail and Zoey have been involved with the Shriners for the last nine to ten years. The family first got involved with the Shriners when they lived in South Dakota and found out that the girls' older brother had been diagnosed with legg-calve perthes disease. When Abi and Zoey traveled to Minnesota for their brother's diagnosis, that gave them an opportunity to receive better treatments for their pediatric scoliosis while in the same facilities.

Abigail and Zoey Switzer are sisters that have had the same Shriner experience together for the past 9 - 10 years. Abigail is 15, doing freshman homeschool classes and Zoey is 12 and working on sixth grade. When the sisters are not studying for school Abigail likes to read, craft and play the ukulele, while Zoey enjoys computer games like minecraft, as well as reading and baking. The two are very active outside and like taking care of their many animals. Abi has a leopard gecko named Fern and Zoey has 3 guinea pigs, Wibby, Wibby and Mary. They both help their mom, Darcy, take care of the chickens they raise in their backyard.



There are still some travel arrangements that the Shriners still help with. Both girls are looking forward to many closer outreach clinics that will be in South Dakota so they can be closer to their grandparents more often. The family has provided specialized treatments to their backs because of the Shriners, the family has had help with travel arrangements and access to the correct scoliosis treatment. The Shriners were able to help provide a surgery to Zoey and Abigail's brother so he is now able to walk.



The girls' are hopeful that because their brother was able to access the surgery he needed because of the Shriners, that they will continue to access the correct treatment so they can avoid spine surgery. The whole family is very thankful because of the Shriners help. Their family is able to live an active life without anyone being in constant daily pain. Without the Shriners the family would not have been able to access the correct treatment the kids needed because of distance and cost.
